COP26 at Highgate School

On Wednesday 3rd November, LAE Tottenham students visited Highgate School where they reinvented their own UN-style negotiations alongside students from Highgate School and other sixth forms. A total of 41 students were present who were divided into small groups to co-operate and collaborate on the challenges, targets, actions and demands for their assigned countries.

Jabiah, from 'UCL' tutor group comment on the day saying: "I really enjoyed the event – seeing how other young people are so passionate about the environment, and hearing their ideas. It has really encouraged me to do more at my own school in the environment committee."

Patricia, from 'Open' tutor group also commented: "It was really inspiring coming here and hearing the different perspectives from countries with different views. The event has helped me understand that, in an ideal world there are differences between individuals, and countries have different needs that must be tackled specifically, in order for our futures to be saved."

Journey to Becoming

Chrisann Jarrett, CEO and founder of 'We Belong' spoke to LAE Tottenham students about her journey becoming a young activist and what inspired her to launch her own charity in 2019.

Students were engaged and found the talk beneficial as it allowed them to think about their own pathways and the impact they can have on society now and in the future. We used a large variety of basic but essential skills to work through the task given. It gave us all an idea of what coding is like, and how it would be if we pursued it as a career. In fact, the experience has made me consider Computer Science as a university course!"

Environmental Society at LAE Tottenham

The LAE Tottenham Environmental Society had the opportunity to chair the London Schools Environment Network.

Year 12 students, Tyarn, from 'Manchester' tutor group and Ifeoma, from 'Birmingham' tutor group did an exceptional work chairing and minuting the meeting, with as many as 50 participants online over zoom, from 14 different London schools discussing issues as diverse as how to invest or bank in a sustainable way, what we can learn for the physical science report written by the IPCC and how different London schools are also moving forward with sustainability programmes.

Ifeoma, from 'Birmingham' tutor group and Hayat, from 'UEA' tutor group also went on a waste walk with the Headteacher at LAE Tottenham, Jan Balon, to thoroughly investigate the end location of the school's binned waste. Additionally, what they found out will form the basis of future programmes and campaigns for the school community.

It is evident that if we throw food in a bin it can easily contaminate recyclable waste, and so we need to educate our community and label our bins carefully to prevent this in the future. To support this ongoing work of educating students and staff about the environment, guest speaker Ed Brewster will be delivering a talk and workshop on climate emergency in the next few weeks.

Accenture Apprenticeship Workshop




