#### David Lammy's Digital Surgery

On Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> May, Year 13 students attended their first ever 'digital surgery' with David Lammy. The programme, run by The Politics Project, seeks to connect young people remotely with their representatives in a meaningful way which will encourage their future political engagement.

As part of their personal development programme, students had prepared for the session by researching Lammy's background and career, as well as carefully drafting challenging questions. The event itself was a huge success; delivered remotely and live streamed to the whole cohort. Twelve students representing each form group asked some extremely probing questions on topics ranging from the government response to COVID, to the future of private schools, as well as David's priorities.
