Key Points For Volunteering

- Know your dress code. You are required to dress formally for the majority of your placements. Exceptions may be youth work or environment projects. You should confirm this with your volunteering coordinator.
- Plan your journey. Check train and bus routes for engineering or road works.
- **Turn up on time.** If your transport is late, contact your volunteering coordinator to let them know ASAP.
- Turn your phone off or put it on silent.
- Ask if you do not understand something or you need more work.
- If you use an epipen or other medication take it with you as you would to school.
